Samples of most of the following pieces of music can be listened to on YouTube or talk to Ray Maulkin, our organist, and he will help you with your choices. You can usually catch Ray after an 11am service (but please be sympathetic if he is in a hurry.)

If you have a particular request you must discuss this with Ray as early as possible. There will be an extra charge for music outside his normal repertoire.

Entry music: - *This is played as the bride walks up the aisle*

Prelude (Te Deum) – Charpentier

Exit music: - *played as the couple walk down the aisle at the end of the service – please be aware that if you are having the bells you will only require a few minutes organ music.*

Toccata (Organ Symphony No. 5) – Widor

Grand March (Aida) – Verdi
